Dear Secretary ABAD:

Greetings!

The Results-Based Performance Management System (RBPMS) is in fact a "Tuwid na Daan" innovation of the Aquino administration. It continuously changes the culture in the workplace, improves the framework of governance, and optimizes government resources toward bringing tangible and intangible results felt by every Filipino. Government agencies, including SUCs, are consistently monitored based on performance in terms of output, outcomes, and impact to society. Well defined performance indicators and quantified targets sustain the emerging economy of our beloved Philippines.

Integrated in the RBPMS is the granting of the Performance-Based Bonus (PBB) to eligible agencies. In the last three years of implementation, the Ramon Magsaysay Technological University had been eligible of the PBB.

The PBB is one of the thrusts of the Garcia administration. The Major Final Outputs (MFOs) under the Performance Informed Budget (PIB) are integrated in the RMTU Strategic Development Plan.

However, in 2015, due to uncontrollable circumstances, one of the performance indicators of the Higher Education Services, the total number of graduates, was 1.33% short of the 90% threshold. In the Congress-Approved PIB FY 2015 GAA Targets, the target was **1,200 graduates**. Only **1,064** were able to graduate in 2015 at **88.67% accomplishment rate**. This is attributed to the following reasons:

1. **The abolition of PDAF and demise of Hon. Antonio Magsaysay Diaz reduced drastically our enrollees due to stoppage of financial assistance.** PDAF's financial assistance entailed provision of matriculation fees and stipends to almost all of our college students who are children of marginalized families. Cong. Diaz's demise on August 03, 2011 was a great loss especially to those who only depend in his financial assistance programs. Some of these students had stopped schooling, some shifted to vocational courses (TESDA) for earlier entry to the workforce while others decided to work to support their family. The first year degree students in AY 2011-2012 who stopped or shifted to vocational courses could have graduated in AY 2014-2015, thus increased the total number of graduates in degree programs.



2. **Occurrence of devastating typhoons.** Zambales experienced Habagat and a number of destructive typhoons in the past years like Yolanda, Glenda, and Juan, which affected the source of livelihood of the families of our students. Some families were forced to transfer residence because of the destructions left by these typhoons.
3. **Effect of state policies of China and the Philippines.** We had Chinese students in our consortium. But due to the heightened territorial claim dispute between these two countries, they were given advisory to go back to China and were not allowed to come back to the Philippines. They were not able to earn their respective degree. Added to this is the hectic policy of DFA for the issuance of student visa.
4. **Low % increase of graduates in degree programs and change of operational definitions of the performance indicators of PBB.** The percentage increase of bachelor degree graduates in the last five (5) years covering 2010 – 2014 was only 4.64%. Using this percentage, the forecast graduate for 2015 was only 1,056 using the 1,009 graduates in 2014 as baseline. In addition, the 2015 budget was prepared in 2014 and data were based on the 2013 accomplishments. The 1,200 target was based on the number of graduates both degree and non-degree programs in 2013.

We hope that the aforementioned reasons can justify the non-attainment of at least 90% of our target in the said performance indicator.
